Impact Snapshot 2024

Reflecting on the incredible progress of **Happy Hearts Indonesia** in 2024, we're filled with immense gratitude for your unwavering support, which allowed us to achieve even more than we had set out to.

Thanks to you, we raised **IDR 28,774,538,632 (USD 1,750,809)**, a **34% increase** over 2023, empowering us to rebuild **42 schools** across Indonesia. What's even more exciting was that **83%** of these schools were constructed using **eco brick from recycled plastic waste**, far surpassing our initial goal of 40%.

Last year was a major milestone in our **#reacHHigher** journey. Along with rebuilding schools, we launched a new initiative to provide clean water, addressing the lack of reliable water sources in eastern Indonesia.

To ensure long-term success, our **School Management Training** program reached **46 schools** across five islands in 2024, equipping them with the tools for lasting impact.

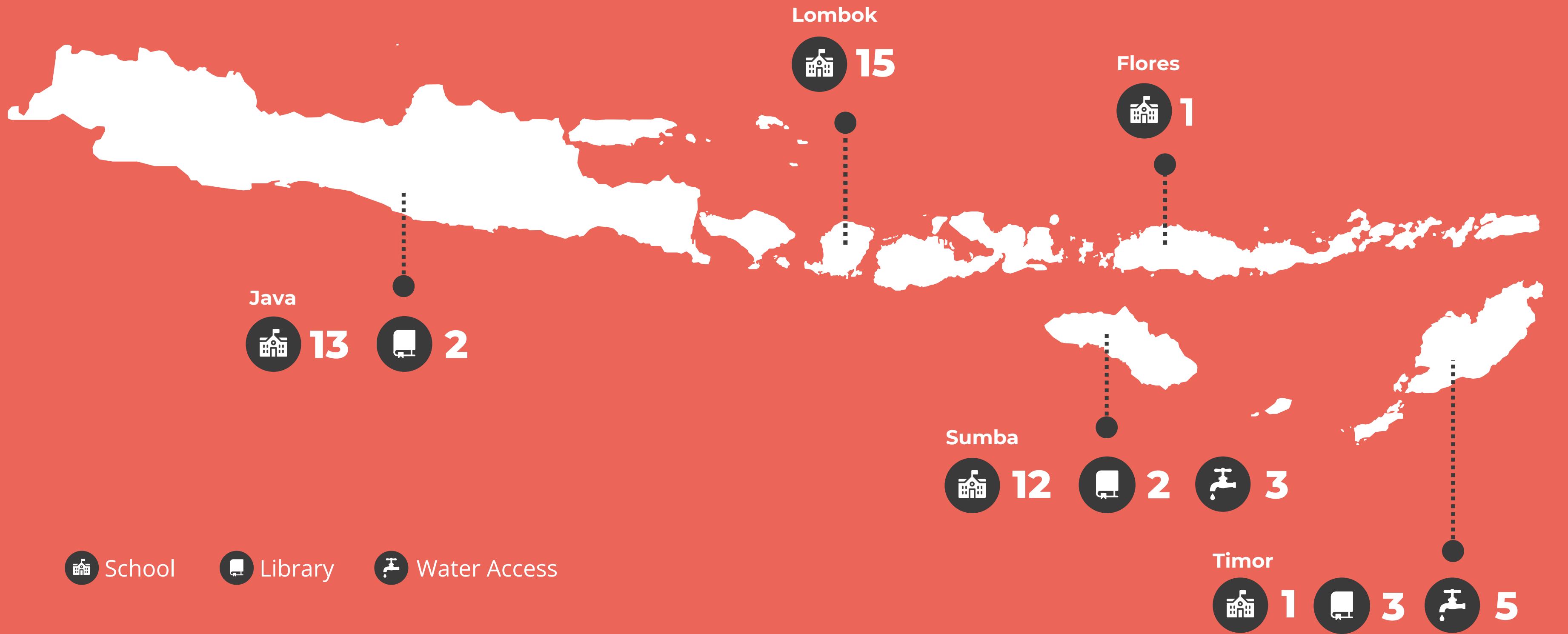

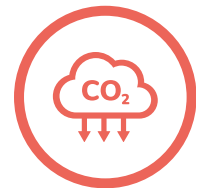

2024 was a landmark year for us as we successfully built **7 new libraries** —**the most in any year to date**. This expansion allowed us to reach more students, distributing over **2,000 books**, and offering a wider range of reading materials. Our goal has always been to provide children with the resources to nurture their literacy skills, and with this achievement, we made a more significant impact in empowering young readers, fostering positive change in their educational journeys.



Water Access

At Happy Hearts Indonesia, we believe that clean water is essential for thriving communities and quality education. Our Water Access Initiative aims to provide sustainable water solutions to schools in underserved areas. In East Nusa Tenggara (NTT), where water scarcity is a major challenge, **50-60%** of the schools we've rebuilt still lack reliable water access. Many of them rely on purchasing water or sourcing it from local villagers.

Last year, we installed bore wells at **8 schools**, providing them with a dependable water source. This initiative not only eliminates the recurring cost of purchasing water for the schools but also gives local communities access to a nearby water source



School Management Training

Happy Hearts Indonesia's **School Management Training (SMT)** helps schools plan effective, sustainable programs. To date, we have trained 92 teachers in the schools we've rebuilt. TK IT Bina Insani, a standout participant, won first place in North Lombok's competitive School Nutrition Garden Program (Project Bunzilah). Their success shows the impact of SMT, helping them manage Project Bunzilah, which supports student nutrition and generates school income.

5 to 3 Year Development Program

We've streamlined our post-construction program from 5 to 3 years for greater efficiency. The updated focus now includes **Waste Management** and **School Management Training**, covering financial management, green skills, and community involvement. This shorter timeframe allows for direct implementation, closer monitoring, and quicker adjustments for sustainable results. It's also more cost-effective, as the new, comprehensive training requires fewer resources. Evaluations show that most school improvements happen within the first 2-3 years, making this the most effective approach for lasting impact.
